

### Shocking Statistics

One in four adults and 10 percent of children in the United States will suffer from a mental health illness this year. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), mental disorders are more common than heart disease and cancer combined.

The federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's (SAMHSA) 2013 report states that 9.6 million adults have a serious mental illness, such as major depression, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, panic disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder and borderline personality disorder. Treatment plans for mental illness typically require medications, therapy and participation in peer support groups.

Untreated mental illness is a major contributor to unemployment, homelessness, substance abuse and suicide. Many people suffering from mental illness are taken to jail, or to an emergency room rather than receiving immediate treatment for their mental illness.

### RRC, an Alternative to E.D. Drop-offs – No Wrong Door

RI Crisis' Recovery Response Center (RRC) is a behavioral health facility providing an alternative option to Emergency Department drop-offs. If the person in need of care is suicidal or exhibiting symptoms of substance abuse and/or mental illness, and is not in urgent need of medical intervention, First Responders may take them directly to any door at the RRC.

The RRC provides medication, group therapy, crisis stabilization as well as referral for ongoing outpatient services. The average length of stay at the RRC is 1-4 days.

For those experiencing a mental health issue, the RRC is a more appropriate placement than an emergency room. Mental Health providers are able to address the concerns much more quickly, and the patients' mental health and basic medical needs will be attended to in an environment that is safe and comfortable.
